At 7:00 a very unique opportunity—we will hear a special presentation by **Terry Eddinger** who works with Samaritan's Purse assisting those impacted by hurricane Helene.

Rear Admiral Eddinger, U.S. Navy (Retired), who was our guest preacher back in October, earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Gardner Webb University, a Master of Divinity from Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, and a Doctor of Philosophy from The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. He was commissioned in the U.S. Navy in 1995, reaching the rank of Rear Admiral. Terry will share heart-wrenching videos and personal experiences with Samaritan's Purse to **help us better understand the value of our work on April 26th, that will benefit our Western North Carolina neighbors**. Also, again this year, volunteers may pre-purchase raffle tickets at the meeting in order to avoid the lines on Saturday.

Why We Help

Terry Eddinger with Samaritan's Purse who will speak at our Cruise 'n Barbecue volunteer's meeting on Thursday evening, April 24th shared the following on Facebook:

Paula was one of my cases. Paula lived in a house that any reasonable person would say they never had to fear flooding. The creek nearby was over 100 yards away and down a hill. In Hurricane Helene, the creek rose vertically 40 feet! It filled an area over 300 yards across with fast moving water. Her neighbor (across the street and closer to the creek) said the water rose over 15 feet in less than 30 minutes. A young man in a kayak told Paula she had to leave her home, as her home was filling with water. He told her to get on the kayak. She is 72 years old and walks with a cane. She said, "I can't." He said, "You have to. The water is rising fast, and you have nowhere to go." After a few more times saying no, she finally got on the kayak. They tried to leave the neighborhood by paddling down the street but couldn't. The water was too swift. They went between the houses to her backyard. Before reaching the water's edge, she fell off the kayak. She doesn't remember how, but somehow, she got to the edge of the water. (She can't swim.) She has a steep bank behind her house that connects her place with the next neighborhood higher up. Fortunately, she had a lawn service clean the underbrush off the steep bank a few weeks earlier or it would have been impassible. Neighbors on top of the bank lowered an extension ladder so she could climb it. But she wasn't able climb it. So, they tied her to the ladder and pulled the entire ladder up the bank. She was saved. Other neighbors climbed the ladder to safety too. Still others, overtaken too fast by the water, climbed trees to stay out of the water. No one in this neighborhood died that day. Her house had to be gutted from 4 feet and below. Samaritan's Purse bought some appliances, building materials, and bathroom fixtures for her and Reach Global installed them. She is one of many being helped in western North Carolina.

We thank God for the opportunity to help our neighbors such as Paula through St. Paul's Cruise 'n Barbecue on April 26th.
